Combined Annual Activities Report Training Session 2020-21











NCC has offered a helping hand to civilian authorities in the country's fight against COVID-19 by extending the services of cadets under 'Exercise NCC Yogdan'. NCC Yogdan involves the distribution of food, dry ration, sanitizers and masks among the people.The camp was held on 19th April to 17th May,2020.

The two cadets, SUO Ridhima Khanna and JUO Aartika Bhayana, of the NCC COY of St. Stephen's College were deployed at a government school. The task was alloted to JUO Aartika Bhayana. . Many awareness sessions were held during this camp. Their tasks was to spread awareness among the people about the importance of sanitization and social distancing during this pandemic time. The clothes were distributed to the people who were in quarantine. They made masks during the camp and distribute them among the public.



International Yoga Day

The NCC COY of St. Stephen's College actively took part in the International Yoga Day celebrations from 17th of June to 24th of June. The celebrations started off with Orientation Awareness wherein the cadets made posters, videos and put messages on twitter and other social media platforms to spread awareness about the Physical, Mental and spiritual benefits that can be derived by practising Yoga. This was followed by making Yoga, Aerobics and high intensity workout videos with family groups at home. The Cadets then took on some outdoor activities like cycling, running, Morning walk and uploaded their photos with the record of distance they covered using various apps on mobile phones and smart watches. Other Activities taken under the Yoga Day celebration include article writing on important topics like healthy diet, use of clean drinking water and taking care of oral health. Best three articles were awarded and posted on social media. Also a video message from a Doctor was made and disseminated to NCC Cadets.



Year 2020 stands witness to one of the most gravest pandemics that hit the world in the modern era. Hence, during those challenging times, The NCC COY of *St. Stephen's College*, in collaboration with Enactus, took up the initiative to spread awareness amongst the economically weaker sections of our society and the senior citizens regarding the precautionary measures that can be taken in order to combat with the SARS-COV-2, commonly called the coronavirus.

The **aim** of the initiative was to educate them and make them well acquainted to face the challenges that the pandemic brought with it and also equip them to not only face these challenges but also protect their families and friends during these uncertain times.

Through this initiative, we were successful in educating some of the most hard hit sections of society including domestic helpers, vendors, daily wage workers, and the most vulnerable sections of elderly people about the various preventive measures suggested by WHO which included steps like:

- □ Regular washing of hands with Use soap and water, or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- □ Maintaining a safe distance from anyone with cold or cough.
- □ Wearing a mask in public spaces, especially where physical distancing is not possible.
- □ Not touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Covering your nose and mouth with your bent elbow or a tissue during coughing or sneezing.
- □ Home quarantine in case you feel unwell.
- □ If you have a consistent fever or cough, accompanied by difficulty in breathing, seek medical attention immediately.

Through our mission, we were successful in affecting over 50 members directly and nearly 500 people indirectly. Not only did people of vulnerable sections, but we were also able to impact a wide demographic, covering all age groups spanning, from 16 to 50 years of age, belonging to a vast range of ethnicities. This was accomplished through our facilitators across the country. The initiative continued for a week, followed by the collection of videos which spanned over a period of two weeks. These were then compiled and will be publicized to a viewership of over one thousand people in order to spread awareness on the importance of educating those who are most vulnerable to the illness.







Enactus, St. Stephen's College

Enactus was a collaborative initiative of the NCC COY of St. Stephen's College to spread awareness amongst the economically weaker sections of society and senior citizens on precautionary measures against the covid-19 virus.

In this initiative the cadets personally talked and taught the under privileged people how to properly wear a mask, how to maintain social distancing even in crowded places, they talked about the importance of frequent handwashes thereby encouraging the use of sanitizers. A video was made to spread awareness on the importance of educating those who are most vulnerable to the illness.



This was done to better equip them to face the challenges brought upon by the pandemic and protect themselves as well as their families during these unprecedented times.

National War Memorial

Location: near India Gate, New Delhi, to honour the Indian Armed Forces. Inaugurated: 25 February, 2019

The kargil war resulted in huge loss of life and was ended when India regained control over the post and ejected the Pakistani army out of the territory. Kargil Vijay Diwas is celebrated every year on 26th July in the honour of the Kargil War's heroes. On this day in 1999, India successfully took command of the high outposts.

In 2020, the event was organised by Delhi Directorate in online mode due to Covid. Dr. Devendra Hudda was the head of this event and Prof. Rama, Principal of Hansraj College University of Delhi was the Chief Guest. Around 1000 cadets participated in this event. CO and ADG of NCC were also present in this event.In this event, a video on war memorial was displayed. Many competitions like poetry, poster making were held online. E-certificates were awarded to all those who participated in this event.

Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan or Selfreliant India campaign is the vision of new India envisaged by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. The Vigilance Awareness Week

The Vigilance awareness week 2020, was celebrated from 27 October to November 2020. This week is observed every year by the Central Vigilance Commission during the week in the birthday of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel (31 October) falls.

The Vigilance awareness is taken up to encourage all stakeholders to collectively participate in the fight against corruption and to raise public awareness regarding its existence. Corruption is dishonest or fraudulent conduct by those in power. Central

Vigilance Commission is an apex Indian governmental body created in 1964 to address governmental corruption which endeavours to promote integrity, transparency and accountability in public life. The commission has, therefore, been advising all organisations to identify and implement effective preventive measures to fight corruption.

The theme for 2020 Vigilance Awareness Week was vigilant India, Prosperous India(Satark Bharat , Samriddh Bharat). NCC cadets usually conducted rallies to spread awareness about the Vigilance Awareness Week to local citizens of our country. But this year due to the ongoing Covid pandemic , no physical events were planned to ensure safety and proper social distancing instead cadets used online platforms.

E- pledges were signed by cadets as well as their family and friends, undertaking the oath to fight corruption and to dissuade their friends and family from partaking in this evil.











Pulse Polio

Pulse Polio is an immunisation campaign established by the government of India to eliminate poliomyelitis (polio) in India by vaccinating all children under the age of five years against the polio virus. The project fights polio through a large-scale, pulse vaccination programme and monitoring for poliomyelitis cases.

In India, vaccination against polio started on 1985 with Expanded Programme on Immunization (EPI). By 1999, it covered around 60% of infants, giving three doses of OPV to each.

The coy, which comprised 30 cadets (15 girls and 15 boys), was led by GCI Prathiba Ma'am and Mahesh Bhatt Sir. The cadets were required to administrate the vaccine orally to the children in the presence of their parents at railway stations.

On 27 March 2014, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared India a polio free country since no cases of wild polio had been reported in for five years.

The campaign was supported by organisations including the Indian federal and state governments, international institutions, and non-governmental organisations. It is part of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, spearheaded by Rotary International, the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.









A tribute to Mahatma Gandhi, the Rashtriya Swachhata Kendra (RSK) was first announced by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 10th April 2017 at the centenary celebrations of Gandhiji's indigo agitation, the Champaran Satyagraha. The RSK has been established at the Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti at Rajghat in New Delhi - a dynamic experience centre to actively engage with citizens to impart information, awareness, and education around Swachhata in an interactive format with a balanced mix of digital and outdoor installations racking India's transformation from having over 50 crore people defecating in the open in 2014 to becoming open defecation free in 2019.

Cadet Neha and Cadet Anet went for the RSK visit which was held on the 24th of March. There, they were informed about the entire journey of the cleanliness campaign. They learnt about how it started, its development and the success of the program. They were told about the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan which the Hon'ble Prime Minister undertook on the 2nd of October 2014, to commemorate the 150th birthday of Mahatma Gandhi. Its goal was to make the country open defecation free by 2019.





The rural component of the Mission, Swachh Bharat Mission, Grameen (SBM G) has witnessed unprecedented progress with increase in rural sanitation coverage of the country from mere 38% to around 100% today. Under SBM(G), more than 100 million toilets have been constructed in last five years. Due to universal coverage, all States and Union Territories have declared their rural areas open defecation free (ODF) ahead of the target deadline of 2nd October 2019 – a befitting tribute to Mahatma Gandhi on his 150th birthday anniversary. The key instrument in leading the sanitization revolution which made India ODF was the people's participation which transformed the Mission into a Jan Andolan (a people's movement).



EBSB

The Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat program aims to improve communication and promote understanding between people of different States/UTs through the concept of a State/UT pair. States undertake activities to promote sustainable and structured cultural ties in the areas of language learning, culture, traditions and music, tourism and cuisine, sports and exchange of best practices.

Throughout the year, week long EBSB camps take place and due to covid they have been shifted to online mode. Competitions like debate, declamation, poster making etc. are organized as part of the camp. 4 cadets of St. Stephen's Coy attended the EBSB camps in months of October and November. These included SUO Ridhima Khanna, Cdt. Manu, Cdt. Chetna Dubey and Cdt. Vishwambhara.
