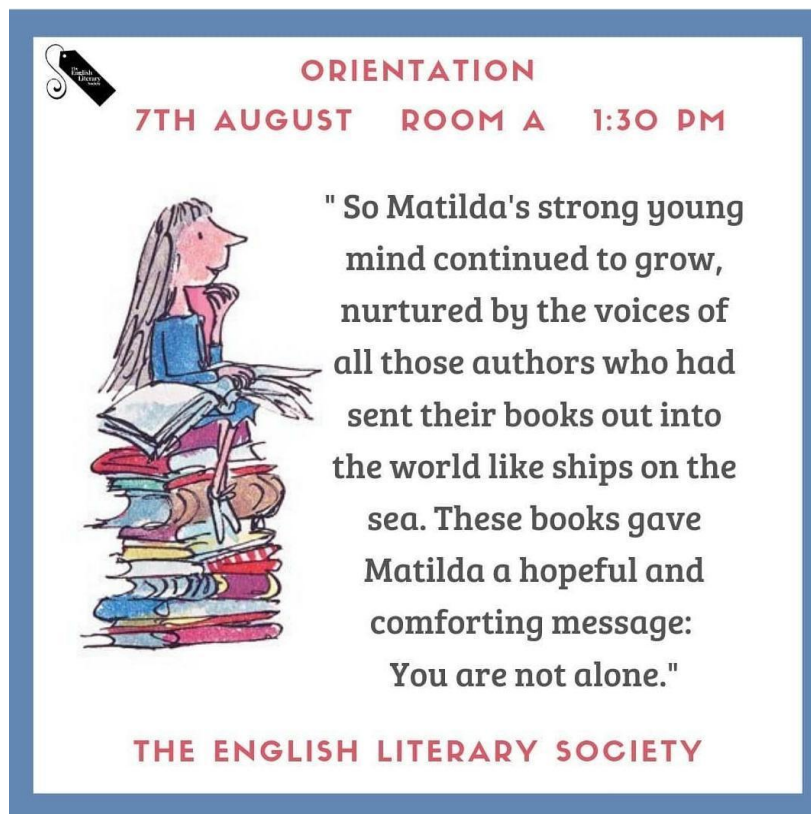




## SOCIETY ACTIVITY REPORT 2019-2020 THE ENGLISH LITERARY SOCIETY

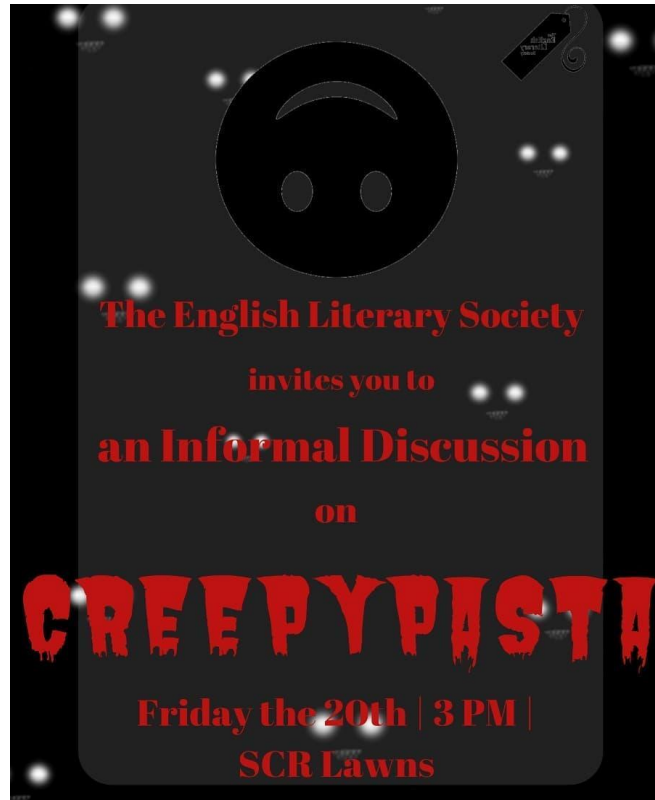


